





"In Memoriam" by Prof. Dr. Benito del Castillo

Dean of the Faculty of Pharmacy at the University Complutense de Madrid President of the EAFP



Good Pharmacist. Good Frenchman. Good European. Good friend. As a professor of inorganic chemistry he was among the first to take office at the Faculty of Pharmacy at the University XI of Paris, in Châtenay-Malabry, when it was opened in 1972, and he served his school as a dean from 1983 to 1997.

The EAFP was founded in Paris in 1992 and he was the first President and cofounder together with Prof. Ch. Bourlioux, Prof. D. Breimer, Prof. A. Florence, Prof. Santos Ferreira, Prof. K.-W. Glombitza, Prof. A. Hincal and many others. Personally, I was member of the Executive Committee, under his presidency. During important meetings where we worked together to take an inventory of pharmacy curricula in Europe and to harmonize them, taking into account diverse opinions and accepting big and small faculties, classical and new ones.

At the annual meeting in Berlin in 1994, he handed over the torch to Prof. A. Florence, the dean of the School of Pharmacy, University of London, In 1995 I had the honour to welcome him to preside the 150th anniversary of the Faculty of Pharmacy of the Universidad Complutense de Madrid, where his human and academic merits were praised by the rector.

When a colleague like Charles Souleau passes away, his works will remain, and those who knew him personally will remember him, but an unrecoverable piece of our common history disappears with him, as if a library or a museum were burned.

I am grateful for having made his acquaintance and having shared his efforts to promote academic pharmacy in Europe. His memory is written in the records of the EAFP, and his successors owe much to his initiative and powerful personality. His example is our obligation.

Programme

Participants in the Conference are advised to schedule their arrival in Tallinn on Wednesday 07 June, where rooms will be reserved for one night at the Hotel "Viru" or equivalent establishments.
