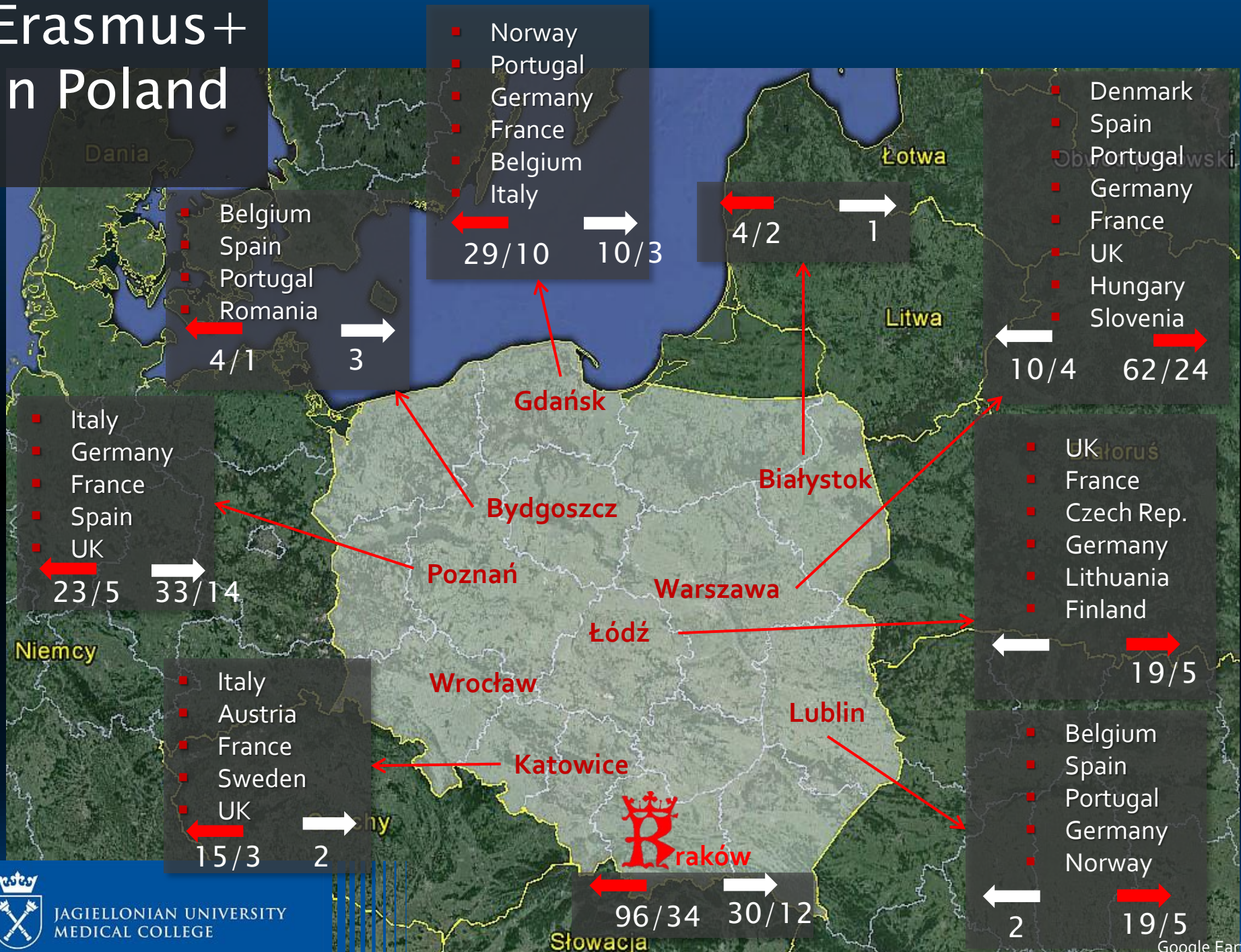

The students' eligibility criteria

The criteria for student applying to the Erasmus+ program:

- To have a status of being the student of the Jagiellonian University or Medical Universities.
- To be a student of at least second year of integrated Master's degree program.
- Has not fully used the mobility period, described in regulations.
- Has to know the lecture language, appropriate for the receiving institution on the level allowing participation in the university studies.
- Has to have the average grade at least 3.5 for the entire previous study period

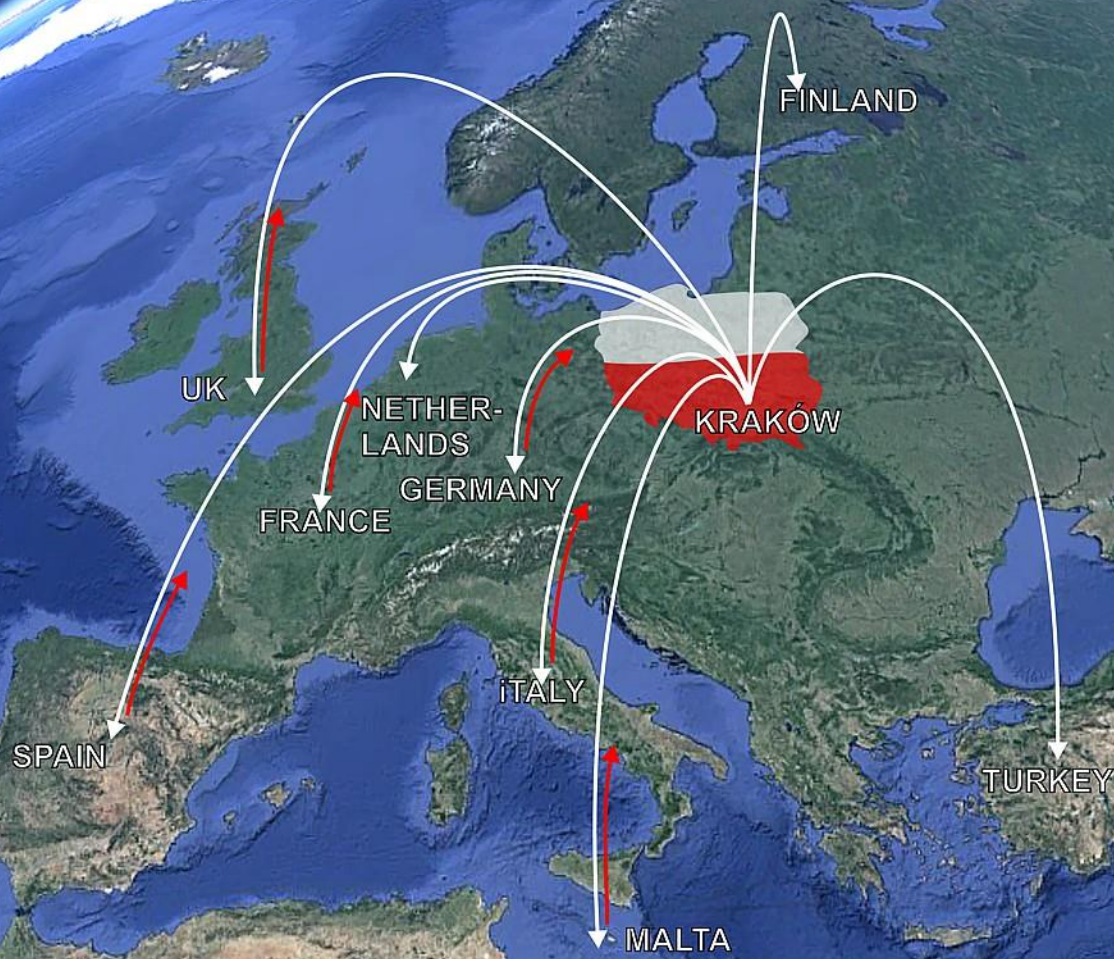


Erasmus+ in Kraków 2012–2015

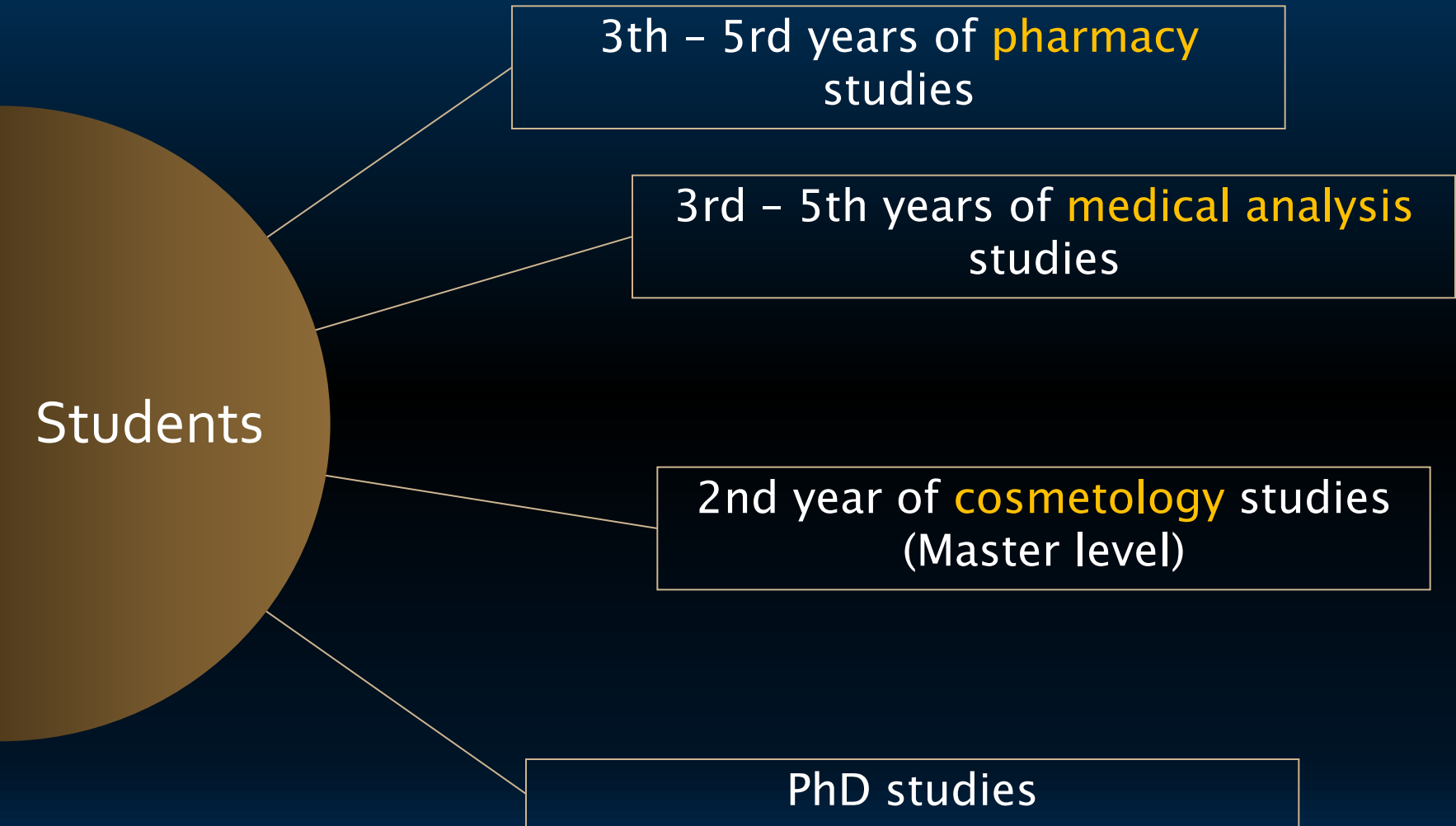

The eligibility criteria for students of the Faculty of Pharmacy at the Jagiellonian University Medical College

- The average grade for the entire previous study period $\geq 3,5$ – (>3.25)

- The average grade for the entire previous study period $\geq 4,00$

or traineeship

Courses in foreign
Higher Education
Institution (HEI)

- Competency in the foreign lecture language on level B2
- Scientific activity (publications, awards, conference presentations)
- Activity in student research groups
- Activity for the academic community, etc.



Students qualification

Qualifying Committee of the Faculty

- Faculty Erasmus program coordinator
- Vice Dean for scientific research and international relations
- Vice Dean for students affairs
- Representative of the Student Council

Students planning the accomplishment of scientific research project or traineeship

- Decisive qualification

Students planning taking courses in foreign HEI

- Conditional qualification up to 31st of May



The qualification criteria for the PhD students

Scientific project realization

- The status of being a student of at least second graduate year
- The short **explanation of the aim of the trip**
- The written consent and opinion from the tutor
- **Confirmation of acceptance from the foreign HEI**
- Permission from the Head of the PhD studies
- **Scientific activity**

Guidelines for Incoming Erasmus Students at the Faculty of Pharmacy Jagiellonian University Medical College

Students applying to study in the Faculty of Pharmacy may choose to:

- follow the pharmacy/medical analysis/ cosmetology courses;
- competency in Polish language (B2 level) for foreign students to follow pharmacy courses,
- participate in the research projects for initiate their research skills.

requirement:

number of ECTS points will be determined upon a decision of stage responsible person;

B2 level in English/Polish (French, Germany)

the scientific area of research topics: drug development in medical chemistry, synthesis technology, pharmacology, toxicology biotechnology; development of dosage forms – pharmaceutical technology, clinical pharmacy, social pharmacy
