

Structure of Bachelor test at UAntwerp

1st bachelor

Bachelor test partim I: written communication on medicines (3 ECTS)

- Acquaintance with library and scientific databases
- How to search scientific literature
- Writing a popular-scientific article

2nd bachelor

Bachelor test partim II: oral communication with patients (3 ECTS)

- Interview with 2 chronically ill patients
- Writing report
- Oral powerpoint presentation

3rd bachelor

Bachelor test partim III: (international) internship (3 ECTS)

- Internships in several fields of the pharmacist
- Writing reports
- Oral powerpoint presentation

Step 1: Capture a suitable foreign location

Criteria

- Easily accessible
- Affordable travel costs and accommodation
- Foreign university has a faculty of pharmaceutical sciences
- Possibility to visit a community pharmacy and/or hospital pharmacy
- Possibility to visit a pharmaceutical company or research institute

Possible strategies

- Random writing of foreign pharmacy faculties
- Targeted contact with persons with whom a collaboration already exists
- Networking with international organizations (e.g. EAFP)

Step 2: *Previsit* foreign location by teachers

Aims

- First real acquaintance with the local host (and his entourage) on site
- Elaborate/align a program
- Making practical agreements regarding transport, student guidance, division into groups, time management etc.
- Exploration of faculty and city
- Evaluation of hotel

Step 3: Scheduling international internship

Full week, preferably at the end of February or March

Step 4: Informing students

Info session 1: at start of academic year

General information about (international) internship

Info session 2: at start of second semester

- Practical information about the departure
- Detailed overview of the program abroad
- Details about the hotel
- Information about poster and powerpoint presentation

Step 5: Giving assignments

Group assignment: make English poster on pharmaceutical research

Students prepare in group (5 people) an English poster about pharmaceutical research that is ongoing in one of the research laboratories of the faculty

Individual assignment: Work out PPT presentation about chosen research topic

Each student prepares an oral presentation about the chosen research topic (max. 10 minutes)

Introductory lesson: 'Giving academic presentations in English'

Aim:

Providing tools to give presentations in English that radiate professionalism

Themes:

- Content: tips on selecting relevant content
- Delivery: tips for a professional delivery
- Structure: useful phrases and linking words
- Visual aids and illustrations: some tips, useful phrases and vocabulary
- Dealing with questions: tips on how to deal with questions from the audience

In collaboration with the coördinator Academic English, UA-Linguapolis

Coaching:

- To practice presentations just before departure abroad
- To give feedback on content, speaking style, building of slides and timing























Summary
